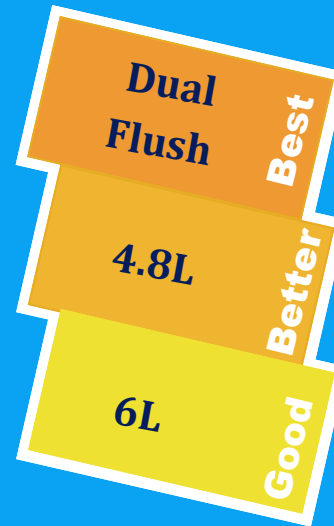

Toilet Buying Tips

Low flow or Standard?

Go Low-Flow!

Flushing the toilet typically uses more water than any other activity in the home! If you want to get serious about saving water and money, a low-flow toilet (6 litre volume or less) is the best choice. Remember, higher volume does not necessarily make a toilet more effective.



Dual Flush

Dual Flush toilets feature two flush options: one that uses less water (for liquid wastes) and another that uses the total amount of water in the tank (for solid waste). Dual flush toilets let you use only the amount of water you need for each flush.

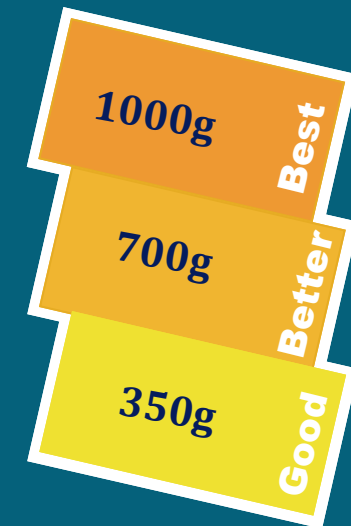
How do I know the toilet will work?

Maximum Performance (MaP) Rating System

MaP is a North American-wide toilet rating system that says how much waste is eliminated in a single flush. A higher gram rating ensures that more waste can be disposed of effectively. Knowing a toilet's MaP rating helps you know that your new toilet is going to work well for your needs.
